Watch the Dove Beauty commercial. Make a list of all the persuasive tactics used in media to sell a product.
Interpretive Questions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • More than one "right" answer • Answer must be supported by evidence • Interpret information based on a perspective 	Understanding Key Verbs: interpret, summarize, infer, categorize	In Charlotte's Web, was Templeton a good friend to Wilbur? Use details from the story to support your answer. How would you treat Templeton?
Debate Questions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students take a position on an issue • Justification of the issue, with evidence, is key to the discussion • Difference in opinion or viewpoints will spark conversation 	Applying Key Verbs: Comparing, structuring, deconstructing,	Cell phones and mobile devices are usually banned from classrooms. Do you think students should be permitted to bring their own devices to the classroom? Remember to support your vote with at least two key supporting details or counter a different opinion.
Subjective Questions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Require students to produce information based on personal opinion • Answers will be subjective 	Analyzing Key Verbs: Attribute, organize, deconstruct	Which of the following symbols best represents the land and people of Canada? What does that symbol communicate?
Evaluative Questions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Responses are formulated based on student opinion and belief • Evaluation of an issue, topic, situation, character requires personal viewpoints. 	Evaluating Key Verbs: hypothesize, critique, experiment, review, judge	After completing your novel, identify the hero in your story. What are the qualities of a hero? Do you feel the hero in the story is deserves the title? Remember to support your answer with story details.
Problem Solving	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Present a problem to be solved • Solutions based on knowledge and opinions • Discussion is generated from the different approaches, strategies, and obstacles 	Creating Key Verbs: Designing, planning, inventing, remixing, solving	Consider an alternate ending to the story. Detail the ending and identify reasons for changing the outcome.
